

WHEREAS, the replacement polling locations, have consented to the use of their facilities as election day polling locations for and meets the Election Commission site standards and


WHEREAS, the Coordinator of Elections has given his consent for the locations that are more than one-half mile outside the precinct boundary and,

WHEREAS, St. Paul United Methodist Church has changed their name to St. Paul Methodist Church and,


WHEREAS, the temporary polling place change for 01-05 St. Anne's Episcopal Church is no longer needed as the repairs to the church were successful,

## Administrator's Report

June, 2024

- Building Renovation – the project is on track to start July 1<sup>st</sup>. The Notice to Proceed has been issued. The survey for the parking lot has been completed.
- Parking Issues – There will be no parking near the Operations Center on Election Day. You will need to park on the other side of Nixon or at the lot at the corner of State Road and Mullins Station. There will be a tent to wait under and a shuttle to bring people back and forth. A Sheriff's Deputy is providing security at that lot. More information will be provided closer to election day.
- Community Outreach – we participated in the following outreach events:
  - VR Drive at New Sardis Baptist Church, Golden United Methodist Church, Greenwood, CME Church, PrideFest, the Dragon Boat Festival, State to the Streets (a government “trade show” at New Direction Christian Church), Pursuit of God in Christ Church and the Liberty COGIC AIM Blitz.
  - Voter Education at Juneteenth Festiva at Health Sciences Park and the Memphis International Flea Market on Jackson Avenue.
  - Naturalization Ceremony - We registered 19 new citizens in June.
- High School Registration – so far this school year we have registered 2,483 students. Contrast this with the 1,019 we registered last year. I attribute the increase to the incredibly hard work of our outreach specialists – Sherry Hewlett and Suzanne Thompson.
- Classes – We held our *How to Run for Office* via Zoom and in person. We also held Campaign Finance 101 both in person and online. We had four Deputy Registrar training sessions. Most were held at the Trinity United Methodist Church in Midtown since space in the Operations center is being used for poll worker training.
- Continuing Education - Joe will be attending IT-ISAC Elections Special Interest Group table top exercise at MITRE's National Election Security Lab later this week. I will be attending the Partnership for Large Election Jurisdictions summer meeting in early July.
- Audit - I attended a meeting in Wilson County two weeks ago for all of the TN counties who use ES&S equipment. We met with Bob Brown from the Coordinator's office to learn more about the audit process for ES&S equipment.

- Audit, Continued - We met with representatives of our accounting firms to discuss the changes the new audit process will bring.
